

PRAYERS IN GETHSEMANE

Read all four accounts: Mt. 26:36-46; Mk. 14:32-42; Lk. 22:40-46; Jn. 18:1



Easton Bible Dictionary says: Gethsemane, oil-press, the name of an olive-yard at the foot of the Mount of Olives, to which Jesus was wont to retire Lu 22:39 with his disciples, and which is specially memorable as being the scene of his agony Mr 14:32 Joh 18:1 Lu 22:44 The plot of ground pointed out as Gethsemane is now surrounded by a wall, and is laid out as a modern European flowergarden. It contains eight venerable olive-trees, the age of which cannot, however, be determined. The exact site of Gethsemane is still in question. Dr. Thomson (The

Land and the Book) says: "When I first came to Jerusalem, and for many years afterward, this plot of ground was open to all whenever they chose to come and meditate beneath its very old olive trees. The Latins, however, have within the last few years succeeded in gaining sole possession, and have built a high wall around it...The Greeks have invented another site a little to the north of it...My own impression is that both are wrong. The position is too near the city, and so close to what must have always been the great thoroughfare eastward, that our Lord would scarcely have selected it for retirement on that dangerous and dismal night...I am inclined to place the garden in the secluded vale several hundred yards to the north-east of the present Gethsemane."
