The key to it all is that whatever we do in word or deed, we need to do for the glory of God (Col. 3:17; Mt. 5:16). When we have our priorities straight, we will stay busy with things that will not allow us to become distracted from serving our God and living for Him. Staying busy is important because when we become idle, many times it leads to us saying or doing things that we should not. So, no matter what age you are or what your physical ability is, let's stay busy for the Lord.
